LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

Theatre Gargantua and Factory Theatre reside on the traditional territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit, the Anishnaabe, the Chippewa, the Haudenosaunee and the Wendat peoples. The territory is now home to many diverse First Nations, Inuit, and Métis Peoples. We also acknowledge Tkaronto is a part of Treaty 13 signed with the Mississaugas of the Credit and has long been a part of the Dish with One Spoon wampum belt covenant, an agreement between the First Nations surrounding the Great Lakes to live together sharing the resources of the land and water.

Indigenous teachings from across Turtle Island remain as relevant today as they have ever been. In the context of this production, we are reminded of the words of the Ohenten Kariwatekwen, also known as the Thanksgiving Address, a traditional prayer or greeting recited in Akwesasne. "We who have gathered together are responsible that our cycle continues. We have been given the duty to live in harmony with one another and other living things." Each verse of the address ends with "Now our minds are one". In these times that seem filled with division and disharmony, taking a moment to remind ourselves that despite our perceived differences our minds can come together as one for the good of all is still something that we struggle with. We must continue to work together to find the harmony that has been lost so that our minds can truly be one.

We know that a land acknowledgement alone will not make up for the past, but is a promise to listen and connect with the people who continue to care for this land and meant to be a starting point for further steps toward reconciliation.

Theatre Gargantua is one of Canada's leading multi-disciplinary theatre companies. Since 1992, the company has been devising original physical theatre under the direction of founder Jacquie P.A. Thomas. Our signature process begins with an inspired concept that we distill into a richly layered work over our distinct two-year creation cycle. Our productions explore compelling subjects and meld daring physicality with striking designs underpinned by live original music.

Theatre Gargantua has garnered dozens of nominations and awards across categories including outstanding new play, production, ensemble, direction, sound design, set design, lighting and projection design. Company milestones include extensive touring in the UK, including residencies at the Royal Exchange - Manchester, and Riverside Studios - London, and the presentation of the company's work by Mirvish Productions at Toronto's renowned Royal Alexandra Theatre.
